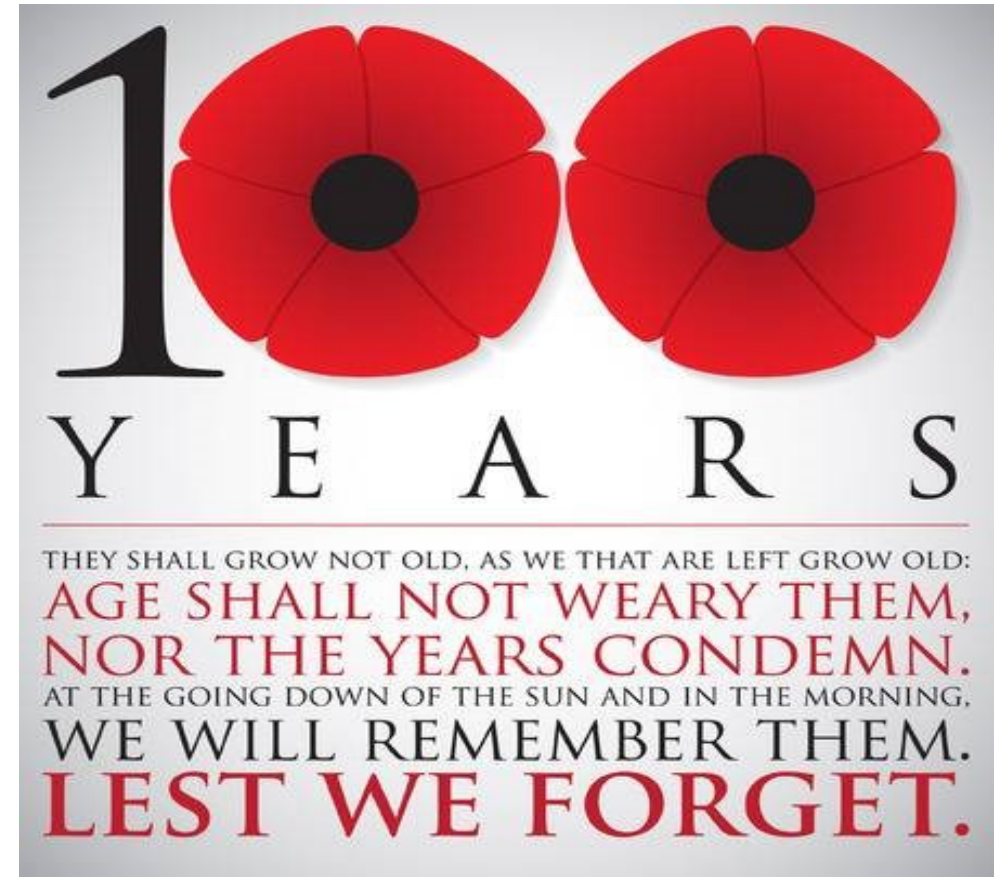

New Preaching Series Has Begun

Our next series, following on the "Fruit of the Spirit", is focused on "*Saints Alive! God's Missional People.*" When the Holy Spirit is alive in us, bearing God's fruit in our lives, others ought to be able to see it. After all, Jesus did say "by their fruit you shall know them" (Mt 7:16,20).

In November and early December we will be preaching through the book *Surprise the World: The Five Habits of Highly Missional People* by Michael Frost. During these coming weeks we will think about how we can show the Spirit's fruit to others so that they can "taste and see" (Psalm 34:8) that the Lord Jesus is good indeed! We will think about how we can change some of our every day habits to allow people to see something different in us than they see in the world; how we can bless, eat, listen, learn and be sent in the world to the glory of God without having to be super religious, or even do anything weird or very difficult. We just have to let the Holy Spirit's fruit come out through us, and we will experience how that can happen practically and enjoyably.
